PRAYING FOR PEOPLE WE LOVE

I was asked recently why prayer matters if the Lord already has a plan. It's a good question. If God has the ultimate power and wisdom to handle every situation properly. What impact will our prayers have? Praying for People we love can be overwhelming to our hearts and minds. Sometimes we want to fix everything. For clarity, here are five things to consider when praying for others. All from the words of the Apostles to the New Testament believer.



1. Prayer is a Biblical mandate.

Ephesians 6:18 says "Pray at all times in the spirit with every prayer and request and stay alert in this with all perseverance and intercession for all the Saints." 1 Timothy 2:1 Says "First of all then I urge the petitions prayers intercessions and Thanksgiving be made for everyone." Paul instructs the church he planted in Ephesus to pray and he tells young Pastor Timothy to pray for the people. We pray for others because we are told to pray.

2. Prayer brings wisdom and understanding.

James 1:5 Says it this way "Now if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God who gives to all generously and without criticizing and it will be given to him."

Asking God for wisdom is a great PRAYER to pray. It will grow our understanding of situations. The Lord also says He will open our eyes as we pray.

Colossians 4:2 "Devote yourselves to prayer stay alert in it with Thanksgiving."

If we are alert and serious about prayer, we will become thankful for the wisdom we receive from the Lord as we pray for others.

3. Prayer provides endurance.

In Ephesians 3:16 Paul prays for others to be strengthened internally. "I pray that He may grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power in the inner man through His Spirit."

Inner strength provides endurance as we deal with difficult situations.

We should pray for others to grow in inner strength.

4. Prayer brings Salvation, Spiritual growth and Faith.

Here is a verse for each of these three.

Romans 10:1 is a prayer for others concerning Salvation "Brothers my heart's desire and prayer to God concerning them is for Salvation."

Colossians 1:9 is about spiritual growth "For this reason also since the day we heard this we haven't stopped praying for you we are asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding."

In Colossians 4:12 Paul talks about a man named Epaphras who consistently prays for the faith of others. "He is always contending for you in his prayers, so that you can stand mature and fully assured in everything God wills."

We should be praying for others to be saved, grow in spiritual understanding and faith.

5. Prayer leads to a comforted and disciplined life.

One of the most well-known passages on prayer is Philippians 4:6 Paul tells believers this, "Don't worry about anything but in everything through prayer and petition with thanksgiving let your request be made known To God."

Over time prayer teaches us how to tell Jesus about all our concerns. So we can relax.

We should not only pray for others, but we should also encourage them to reap the benefits of prayer. A life with less worry and greater discipline.

One Final Word on Praying for others.

PRACTICE

See the Bible verse below 1 Peter 4:7.

Discipline means we have become good at something. Doing it properly is second nature. If you are a diver, you must develop discipline, you must be serious regarding your focus and you must do this to stay safe while diving.

This is how serious our prayer life should be for others as the return of Jesus nears.
